LABOUR'S CHILDREN'S CENTRES SHAME

Lib Dems lead the fight against Ealing Labour's closure of multiple children's centres across the borough

Lib Dem Councillors are speaking up against Ealing Labour's decision to hastily shut down children's centres in this year's council budget before consultation results are released.

Lib Dem Councillors have revealed that the children's centre cuts have been incorporated into the budget **BEFORE** the official consultation took place.

This makes the so-called consultation effectively a 'sham'.

The children's centres are vital for families as they provide support for under 5s and their parents with childcare services.

The Lib Dem Official Opposition will 'call-in' the decision to force more scrutiny of Labour's uncaring

treatment of children.

Lib Dem Councillors Gary Malcolm (Leader of the Opposition) and Jonathan Oxley (spokesperson for children's services) met up with local parents' representatives to listen to their concerns.

Local Lib Dem Councillor Connie Hersch says:

"The national Labour government has already been attacking ordinary people by Winter Fuel Allowance cuts and changes to disability benefits - and Ealing Labour are following the Labour government's footsteps to attack more vulnerable people in society."

Labour-led councils across London, including Ealing, are 'shutting up' local residents and opposition Councillors by increasing barriers to submit questions and debate petitions.

In Ealing, Labour are moving fast to change the rules to make it more difficult to debate petitions by increasing the barrier from 1,500 signatories to 8,000. Under this new rule, important

issues such as children's centre closures cannot be discussed.

Furthermore, Ealing Labour have imposed a limit of 10 written questions per party per meeting.

Lib Dem Deputy Leader **Councillor Jon Ball** says, "The assault on democracy by Labour is a worrying trend across London."

WARD FORUM REPLACEMENT DELAYS... WHAT'S NEXT?

Ealing Labour's half-baked 'Your Voice, Your Town' that replaced the perfectly functioning ward forums has produced no results as local projects have not been commissioned.

The Ealing Labour administration has not finalised the format of these so-called 'Your Voice, Your Town' (which has merged all Ealing wards together) since the initial 'trial' session a year ago.

As a result, small but meaningful and vital projects, which were previously thriving under the old ward forums system have been stalled.

The previous ward forums provided a fund to allow resident participation and decision-making on how money should be spent.

Some of the successful decisions using the old ward forums systems include supporting knife crime

education in schools, funding heritage street signs, and installing new zebra crossings.

The decision-making process on how local projects can be funded has not been confirmed by Ealing Labour.

Councillor Connie Hersch says: "The Lib Dems are campaigning to get our ward forums back to allow residents to have a say on how our Council tax money should be spent."

FIGHTING AGAINST ELDERLY DAY CENTRE CLOSURE

Ealing Labour have been secretive about the closure of this vital day centre that provides respite care, rehabilitation and activities for elderly people until a virtually unknown consultation has ended.

This was under wraps until the Lib Dem Opposition Councillors uncovered these plans. It is understood that Ealing Labour are planning to sell this public land to private developers instead.

Lib Dem Councillors has implored the Council to continue these vital services, but these questions were met with ridicule by Ealing Labour Councillors.

Councillor Jon Ball says: "Protecting services for elderly people are no laughing matter."
