Lib Dem Cllrs trying to save Slough services as Labour's bankruptcy crisis gets worse

A SHOCKING NEW REPORT SHOWS LABOUR COUNCILLORS LEFT SLOUGH IN AN EVEN BIGGER MESS THAN FIRST REALISED WHEN THEY "BANKRUPT" THE COUNCIL IN 2021, & LOST POWER IN 2023

Slough Council has been badly damaged by:

1. Years of Government under-funding key services;

2. Incompetence of Labour Clirs who lost control of the Council's finances with <u>many years of unaudited accounts</u>; cuts, sell-off assets. Slough has had

3. And now, this new report (see red box right). It shows that as the historic record is checked, it becomes clear the council's finances were even worse than first thought!

Commisioners' Report Sept '24

Governments send Commissioners into "bankrupt" councils. They force councils to reform & make cuts, sell-off assets. Slough has had Commissioners since 2021. In 2024 they checked the previous records: "as a result, the future financial position has become more serious."

So, Government, now Labour, appointed Commissioners are demanding more cuts & sell-offs.

How are Lib Dem Cllrs trying to help tackle this terrible Tory/Labour mess?

1. Cllr FranK O'Kelly is chairing the Council's Audit Committee

Since he was elected in May 2023, FranK O'Kelly (see right), has been chair of the Council's Audit Committee. Frank is drawing on his business experience to help sort out the mess. The Committee considers the reports from the professional auditors who are trying to clear up the back-log of unaudited accounts left by Labour. **This is crucial to help identify a way forward to try to rescue Slough Council.**



2. Get more money for roads & facilities from developers in Slough

Most councils use 2 schemes to get money from developers when they are granted planning permission. This money is used to pay for new facilities such as roads, health centres etc. When Labour controlled Slough Council they only used one of the 2 methods, and got in much less money than most other Councils. Lib Dem Cllrs successfully got Slough Council to agree to use both schemes, **& Slough is beginning to get more money**.

3. Cllr O'Kelly is campaigning to keep our Cippenham library services open Slough Council is consulting on plans to close Cippenham library. Frank O'Kelly says: "Libraries are not just for borrowing books, they have evolved into lively community centres. They can be a key support to young, old & vulnerable residents. They can help mothers & the unemployed. If we lose a library it is gone forever. Please help the campaign to save the library. The key thing is to go onto the 2024 libraries consultation page of Slough Council's website & oppose the plans - see back for QR code & petitions"

Cllr Frank O'Kelly's Action File

Cllr Frank O'Kelly: "Ways we can work together please to save Cippenham library":

1. Complete the Council's consultation document - see front page, or use this QR code. The Tory Leader of Slough Council said this will be the key evidence in the decisions on the library.

2. Sign a local petition (Frank helped organise several) & sign the one on Slough Council website (this is separate from the consultation).

Passing motorists are thought to have dumped waste into the communal waste area of apartments in Eltham Ave. **Clir O'Kelly** got the Council to clear the mess.


