## Security and safety

Access to the BC is possible only with a valid conference pass worn with the official lanyard. Conference photo passes must be worn visibly at all times within the secure zone. Anyone found in the secure area without a valid pass will be escorted from the venue.

Attendees will be subject to compulsory bag searches and metal detector wandering at the entrance. To ensure you can access the venue as quickly as possible please only bring essential items with you into the conference venue. Please allow time for queuing during key times – particularly after lunch and ahead of popular events. No sharp objects will be allowed in the BC (including knitting needles and crochet needles).

Under no circumstances will any large bags or suitcases be allowed into the secure zone. Any bag left unattended will be brought to the attention of the police and may be removed and/or destroyed.

The BC is approximately 15 minutes walk (0.8 miles) from Brighton train station; 8 minutes walk (0.4 miles) from Brighton coach station and 1 minute walk (next door to BC) from The Grand Hotel.
